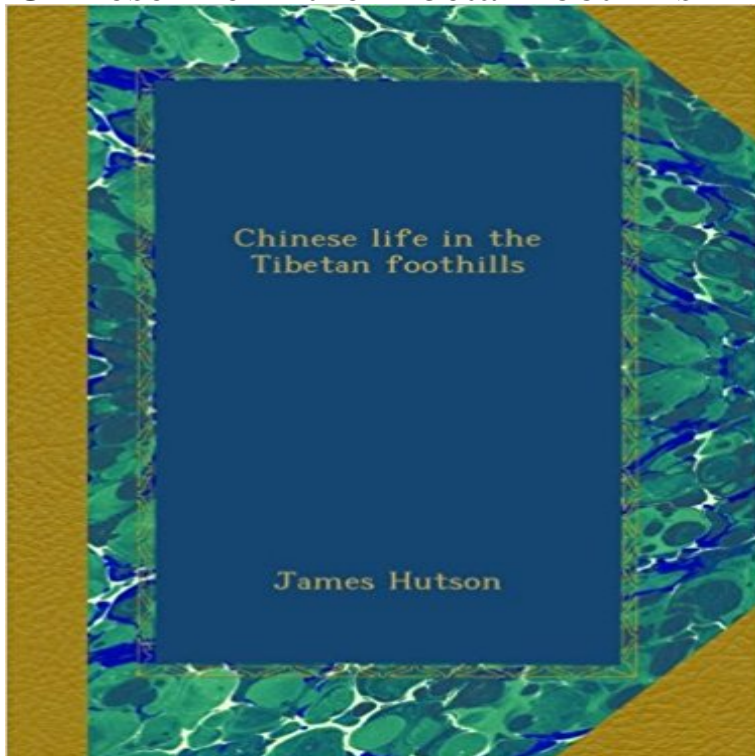


## Chinese life in the Tibetan foothills
