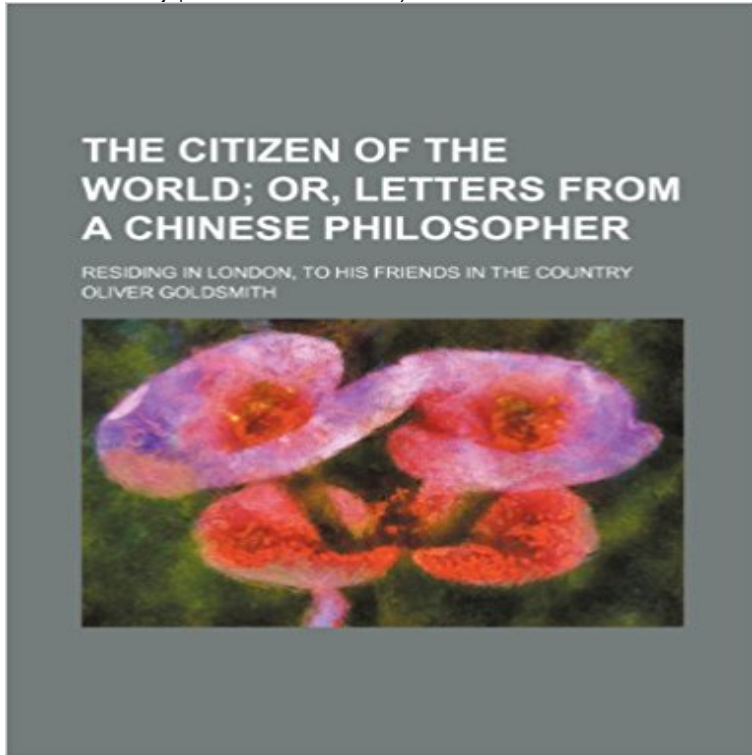

We should feel sorrow, says he, but not sink under its oppression: the heart of a wise man should resemble a mirror, which
